Historical



The children in 5th and 6th classes carried out research on World War II using the internet to find facts. They designed their projects using pages and ComicLife on the iPads and we discussed them and displayed them outside our classroom. We looked at propaganda and how this helped to portray opinions on both sides during World War II. We looked at how WWII contributed to the formation of the E.U.

We looked in detail at the story of Anne Frank and the children picked their favourite quotes from her diary and facts about her and put them together using the apps already mentioned. We looked at the development of the European Union over time and Ireland's part within it.


















Geographical

First and Second Classes studied Italy and used the app Comic Life to present them. They also spoke at Europe Day about their experience and what they had learned.






The senior classes also learned about climate change and how human activity impacts it.




































Cultural & Creative




Institutional
